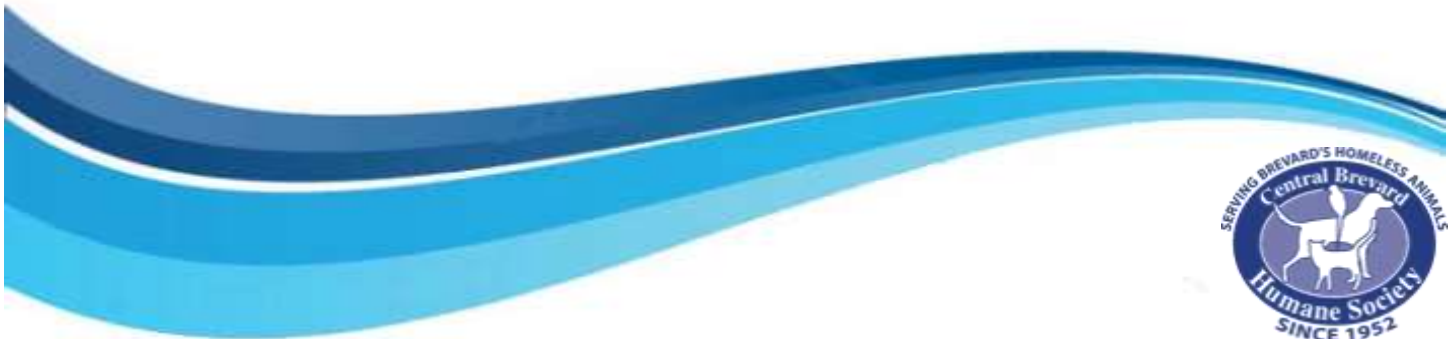


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President's Message

still a good year for us, and although contributions of time and money have not quite rebounded as much as we would like, attendance at our events and the numbers of volunteers who have donated their efforts under these continued challenging economic times has increased. So, this president's message is a reflection of last year's as we again say "Thank you, Brevard", for your support of the homeless animals and our mission to help them.

We feel blessed to have observed an uneventful hurricane season and hope the rainfall continues to keep the ground moist so we avoid the fires again this coming year as we go about fulfilling our mission to reduce and ultimately eliminate the numbers of homeless pets in our area. With the support of the community, and the hard work of management and staff at all of our facilities, this past year

continued to show an increase in the services rendered to the community by our "low-cost" spaying and neutering program. We were blessed to have received a grant from the Florida Spay/Neuter Tag for \$25,000 to help further reduce the number of unwanted kittens born in the community. Partnering with the County Animal Services agency, we will be able to alter 1,250 cats through this grant, thus significantly reducing the feline population explosion amongst the most financially challenged of our community.

From all of us to all of you, again, "Thank You" as it takes the whole community to work together to support the welfare of animals in our community.

Message from the Executive Director



As we approach and plan the festivities of celebrating our 60th year helping animals in our community, we salute those who join us in our “No-Kill” mission as it makes it easier when the whole community is working toward the same goal.

The “low-cost” spay/neuter and wellness Clinic continues to generate more altered and vaccinated pets thus reducing the number of unwanted animals born into our community. Keeping pets healthy prevents them from being turned in to shelters, so as the cost of caring for a pet is greatly reduced, it keeps the pet in its home and leaves the shelters open for those animals which are lost or homeless.

In today’s economy it is difficult at best to raise money to run a facility much less renovate one but this year we intend to do just that. Having the “no-kill” philosophy is just half the equation, the other half requires the facility to be set up in such a way that it brings positive interactions for the animals who live there until they find their forever home. Sadly, the Central Brevard Humane Society does not have the proper setting for the animals to really thrive in. Free-roaming Cat rooms are needed so the stress level for the cats is greatly reduced. Inside/outside pack runs are needed for the natural social drive of the dogs. Neither of these things currently exists in our almost 60-year-old facility, but with the help of the community and grants, we can make it happen so the animals that come to us for the next 60 years will have a more comfortable stay with us.

We understand the challenges for this project but are willing to work hard to make it happen. We will utilize every opportunity to raise awareness and funds for this venture and look to the goodness of the community for support to make this dream a reality. The

Molly Mutt Thrift Shops continue to help defray the costs of caring for the hundreds of animals that come through the Shelter each month. If you have anything you no longer need (even a boat, car, house or RV), please consider donating it to us as we will turn it into money to help the animals at the shelter.

So, if you have a few extra dollars you want to donate or are talented in building and can help us build it, let us know and we will show you our plans for the future for the animals of our community. Every bit brings us that much closer to our goal and helps to further curb the terrible plight of pet overpopulation epidemic in our community. With the support of the community in this endeavor we will prevail. Stay tuned as we prepare for the homeless animals comfort and care of the future!

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Impact, Services & Statistics

Each year, the Central Brevard Humane Society's goal has been to be a leader for animal welfare by caring for thousands of "unwanted" and "abandoned" animals while providing humane education, spaying/neutering & adoptions to Brevard County.

There is "no question" that spaying and neutering saves lives, and our organization does its part to end pet overpopulation in our community by provide the public with a "low cost" Spay/Neuter & Wellness Clinic, located directly behind the shelter.

The clinic has been open now for over a year and has had over 5,000 visitors to it. Besides spaying/neutering, the clinic also provides preventive services for pets like vaccinations, heartworm prevention, flea & tick treatment programs and microchipping.
