PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



What a wonderful year the Brevard Humane Society has had in 2013-2014! **It's a milestone** of which we can all be proud.

The Board continued our Plan of **turning our County into a "No Kill County"**. **Many other shelters have followed our lead.** The County Shelters are going to be taken over by one of our former Board members, Sheriff Wayne Ivey, and he tells us he and his staff will be working very hard and very diligently to upgrade the two County shelters to make them more humane. We are all working to the same goal of putting ourselves out of business. I hope that time comes sooner rather than later.

Of course, another of our main goals (besides turning our **County into a "No Kill County"**) is to **rebuild our current Shelter** on Cox Road in Cocoa which is now over sixty (60) years old. We have been piece-mealing it with improvements for years and really need to just knock it down and build a new state-of-the-art Shelter. **However, it's estimated we need one million dollars (\$1,000,000) and we just can't raise that amount** or secure a donation. As soon as we have extra money, it seems like something major breaks and we use up those funds put away for an up-to-date facility on repairs. Maybe through improvements we can fix it up.

We are still very thankful to Mr. and Mrs. Platano for their generous donation of the building on Merritt Island. It certainly extends, supports and furthers our Mission Statement. The building itself has been painted inside and out, had new window frames installed, and it has been decorated very well. **We opened up a very large "free roaming" cat room with lots of donated new "kitty furniture" and also a special area for smaller dogs to be adopted.** A new fenced-in area has been built right in front of the building for the dogs to romp and **play to their hearts' content.** **Plans have been formulated for the rest of this building and we are excited to put these plans into action.** We will be opening a Premiere Pet Hotel and with our perfect location right off of Route 528 and minutes from **one of the world's largest Ports – Port Canaveral –** we know this build-out will be a huge **SUCCESS!**

I would like to thank Rob Smith, our Vice President, and Justin Ward, our Secretary, for all of their hard work in doing all the legwork for purchasing new computers throughout our buildings and also for installing them, running all the proper wires and, most of all, for teaching our staff how to use new software. **I just can't imagine how much this would have cost us if we had to hire a consultant to do this.** Rob and Justin also investigated and installed a whole new telephone system for both buildings. Thank you very much, Rob and Justin.

I would also like to thank Dianne George from the bottom of my heart for maintaining the budget month to month. I know

what a difficult job this is and I thank her profusely for all her hard, dedicated work for the sake of our animals.

I want to thank Michelle Earltinez for her never-ending research and work on educating us and our Community on how to take care of animals. Michelle keeps up with all the newest laws and ordinances and keeps the Board informed on these changes. She continually works on improving our Clinic and I will be forever grateful to her for this continuing education of our Board and especially to the Community.

I can't thank Jodi Levesque enough for all of her "engineering" input and her continuing work on all our building projects. Jodi gets all of us thinking with her innovative ideas "thinking outside of the box".

And, of course, a big "thank you" to Dennis Gollehon for his continuing, unselfish volunteer work with our animals and assisting Theresa with anything that needs work. Soon we will have our own laundry room at the Shelter thanks in part to Dennis' dedication to this project.

I would like to personally thank Ellen Loegering for all her volunteer work as our in-house "Pet Psychic" and her willingness to help in any way she can. Her work brings in much needed money to our Shelters.

I would also like to thank Julie Clover and Karen Lee for supporting us and volunteering for many fund raising projects that have brought in much needed funds.

I would like to welcome our newest Board Members: Susan Thompson and Tom Yardley, Esq. They have already each made significant input at our Board meetings, and I look forward to working with them in the future.

And, of course, last but not least, I would like to thank Theresa Clifton, our Executive Director, who works tirelessly for the **benefit of all the animals in our community.** **Without Theresa's continuous efforts most of what we have accomplished this past year wouldn't have been completed. Two years in a row now we have received the Cocoa Beach Regional Chamber of Commerce's Business Champion of the Year Award from the efforts she spearheads for CBHS in the community.**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



“Some people talk to animals. Not many listen though. That's the problem.”

- A.A. Milne, Winnie-the-Pooh

As I reflect over the past year, I realize how amazed I always am by the amount of effort we have put into the community to accomplish so many things for the homeless animals,

and, the sheer number of volunteer hours the community has given us to help make that happen. At the same time, the amount of effort still needing to be done to put the **animals in our community out of harm's way is still quite a daunting task.** Of course, everything takes money to make it happen, money that is not so easy to come by in our current economy. We have managed to expand our operations somewhat to increase needed revenue but we have so much more work to do (and need so much more money to do it).

Our Merritt Island Adoption Center has been open and fully operational for over a year now, and has cats, kittens, small dogs and puppies for adoption. This location offers an ideal spot for our Island and beachside residents, which was evident with the 242 adoptions this past year (125 cats and 117 dogs). We have partnered with local artists in the community to have their work adorn the walls of the facility. Thirty-five percent (35%) of the proceeds are donated back from the artists to help the animals, their way of supporting our cause. Our current plans are to expand these operations to include a **“Premier Pet Hotel” for boarding and day care, so when you are on vacation, your pet will have a “staycation”.** We are currently in the design process and hope to be under construction within the upcoming year.

The Shelter on Cox Road has been a source of great frustration for some time. We moved into the building in 1963 and now the old metal pipes under the facility are deteriorating and the general maintenance and upkeep of the facility overall is expensive. Since, we do not have the funding to raze the building and start over, we are still working on the facility one room at a time. Some progress has been done this last year in the building as we have installed the sound suppression panels in the Kennel area, and what a difference it makes for the animals and visitors! We are also in the middle of planning the new laundry facilities as the existing area is no longer viable. The laundry room is at a critical junction due to the pipes failing underground. It is a top priority to complete as soon as possible, and we hope to have it done within the new year. The general overall operation

of the Shelter itself, managed by Shelter Manager, Robin Ruhe, runs like a well-oiled machine on a daily basis.

I cannot “thank” Robin enough for her dedication and passion for the homeless animals. She is there every day overseeing every detail of their care.

We still have work to do at the “Low-Cost” Spay/Neuter & Wellness Clinic as our community's needs change and grow. Challenges for the Clinic have been with the retention of qualified staff as we expand our services. It takes dedicated animal-loving qualified staff to really understand the mission to work here, but that is just the kind of employee the Clinic needs. I am confident we will add those candidates to our staff as they will help us with our effort to becoming a no-kill community.

As we continue to strive towards making Brevard a **“no-kill” county, we recently were awarded a \$25,000 grant from the Florida Animal Fund with the funds dedicated to FREE spay/neutering of cats in our community.** This, of course, will aid in our endeavors to **make Brevard a “no-kill” County, but it is only a small portion of the problem with over population.** Education is **the key... pet owners need to acknowledge the problem and spread the word for spaying and neutering.** For now, we are offering free spay/neuter to low-income and community cats.

The Central Brevard Humane Society was also awarded the Cocoa Beach Regional Chamber of Commerce, Business Champion of the Year Award (2013), with special recognition by Senator Bill Posey. This award exemplifies the hard work and dedication put forth by all of my staff and volunteers. I could not be more proud of their efforts and was honored to receive the award for the Organization.

I would like to “thank” the Board of Directors, my staff and the many “unsung heroes” who have either donated money or their time to help our fight. Without you, we would not be able to succeed, and in the end, it is only **the animals that suffer if we are not successful. Let's keep it going, just for them!**

For over 63 years, the Central Brevard Humane Society... Brevard's Humane Society's main goal has been to be a leader for animal welfare in Brevard by caring for "unwanted and abandoned" animals while providing humane

education, spaying/neutering & adoptions at two locations in Cocoa & Merritt Island to the public.

There is "no question" that spaying and neutering saves lives, and our organization does its part to end pet overpopulation in our community by providing the public with our "Low Cost" Spay/Neuter & Wellness Clinic, located behind the Adoption Center (Shelter) in Cocoa.

The clinic has been open for a little over four years now providing services to Brevard County residents like spaying/neutering, microchipping, vaccinations, heartworm prevention, and flea & tick treatment programs for pets.

The number of visitors to the Adoption Center in Cocoa has decreased from 10,314 last year to 8,512 guests this year - due to the opening of our Merritt Island Adoption Center. This year Merritt Island had 3,187 visitors to their facility. While the Molly Mutt Thrift Shops in Melbourne, Merritt Island, Palm Bay & Rockledge have continued to experience a continuous flow of donations and sales at their shops.

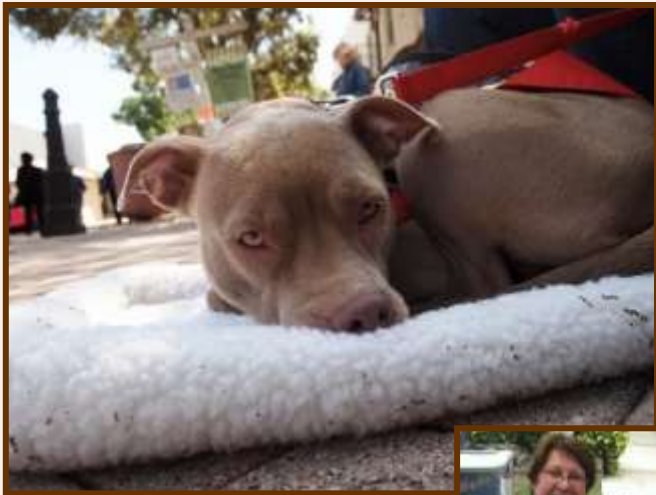
One of the best ways we have to inform & educate the public about the overwhelming amount of homeless animals in Brevard is through our Adoption Programs. Monthly, we participate in a variety of community outreach events, as well as our reoccurring monthly events.

Other programs and services we provide to Brevard County residents are Cash for Trash Program; Cremation & Euthanasia Services; Foster & Rescue Program; HEARTS Program; Lost & Found Pet Service; Membership Program; Paws & Stripes Program; Rainbow Bridge **Community Chapel Services; "Spay It" Forward** Program; T.L.C. Program; Precious Paws Story Time Program; and our Volunteer Program.

These types of community events & programs enable the Humane Society to promote both Adoption Centers, as **ideal locations for finding "unconditional love" by adopting a homeless pet.**



SOCIETY AMBASSADORS (VOLUNTEERS)



The Central Brevard Humane Society is proud to say that it lives in a community that cares enough about the welfare of animals to have a community-funded and supported **“no kill for space” animal shelter.** We could not do all that we do without the help of many dedicated volunteers. Our volunteer base continues to grow with the recent addition of our Merritt Island Adoption Center. During the past year, our volunteers logged 27,545.25 hours of service, with 3,126 contributed by court-ordered community service volunteers.



We continue to conduct recurring monthly offsite awareness and adoption events (Foo Dog Days at Foo Bar in Melbourne & Sunflower House inside Merritt Square Mall) and our annual fundraising events (like Mardi Gras Paws in the Park - \$4,353; Tuxes & Tails Gala - \$37,943; Paws at the Pier - \$6,520; and Paws in the Park - \$3,744), that consistently remind Brevard of the on-going issues of homeless, neglected and abandoned companion animals and also provide us with the opportunity to secure much-needed funding that sustains our operations.

Our volunteers are a very critical component in the success of our organization! These faithful supporters are a major part of a network of hundreds of thousands of people working to make the world safe and more humane for all homeless animals. They make the jobs of everyone working for animals a little easier by lending a much needed hand, helping to educate the public and spreading the message of responsible pet ownership and animal protection.
